

You should only use genuine Honda power steering fluid in any Honda. Brake boosters are generally run off of vacuum from the engine. The power steering pump is basically a hydraulic pump that only powers the power steering rack. The power steering system controls the pressure accumulator, which is the booster for the brakes. If you



Connect the vac pump to it with the engine running and pump it until the pump whines then drop the vacuum a little, run it like this for 15 min under vacuum. Leave the system under high vacuum for a few hours even overnight, check the vacuum often to make sure its still holding as air bubbles drop the
