

Does Massachusetts have a solar incentive program?

The SREC II program reached its cap in 2017. As a result, the state created a new solar incentive program known as the Solar Massachusetts Renewable Target(SMART). The state launched this program in late 2018. Property owners are not eligible for both incentives.

How do you calculate energy credit in Massachusetts?

In calcu-lating the available credit amount, the taxpayer must subtract from the \$1,000 maximum any energy credit previously taken on that residence. The address of principal residence in Massachusetts must be the ac-tual street address of the residence, not a PO box. A summer or vaca-tion home does not qualify as a principal residence.

How is SREC price determined in Massachusetts?

In Massachusetts, an SREC's price is determined by five primary factors: the SREC program design, supply, demand, the Solar Alternative Compliance Payment (SACP), and the Solar Credit Clearinghouse Auction (SCCA). Massachusetts has two separate SREC programs: SREC I and SREC II.

Who qualifies for the energy credit?

Only renewable energy source property used for residential purposesqualifies for the energy credit. When at least eighty percent of the use of such property is for residential purposes, the entire amount of the renewable energy source expenditure may be used to compute the credit.

Are energy credits refundable?

Lines 9 through 11. If the amount of energy credit available in line 8 is more than your total tax in line 9,less any Limited Income Credit and/or Credit for Taxes Paid to Other Jurisdictions,the excess may be carried over three succeeding years. Excesses are not refundable. Note: You must complete and enclose Schedule EC



with your return.

Customers installing these projects can claim a tax credit of up to 30% or more of the cost of the energy investments if certain



Massachusetts has a solar tax credit called the Residential Renewable Energy Income Tax Credit. Homeowners can claim this credit on their state tax filing, and it's worth 15% of the cost of the solar system (up to a maximum tax credit of \$1,000).

Massachusetts law provides that solar energy systems and wind energy systems used as a primary or auxiliary power system for the purpose of heating or otherwise supplying the energy needs of taxable property are exempt from local property tax for a 20-year period. 100% exemption for 20 years

Individuals installing qualified solar and wind projects in Massachusetts may be eligible for a personal income tax credit worth the lesser of 15 percent of project costs or
