



What is Akon Lighting Africa?

Akon Lighting Africa is a project started in 2014 by music artist Akon with Samba Bathily and Thione Niang which aims to provide electricity by solar energy in Africa. Their initial technique is to install solar street lights and small energy systems.

What did Akon do for Africa?

In just one year, Akon's initiative was a smashing success by providing 14 African nations, including Guinea, Senegal, and Sierra Leone, with sustainable, solar-powered electricity via street lamps and solar panels.

How many people are employed by Akon Lighting Africa?

Upon graduation, the individuals are hired by the company. To date, Akon Lighting Africa has provided 18 countries and millions of people with electricity, while employing over 5,000 people. Distraction-free reading. No ads.

Why is Akon Lighting Africa so controversial?

In large part because of his fame, the roughly two-year-old Akon Lighting Africa initiative has drawn a lot of media attention, but also generated a fair amount of curiosity and skepticism. Some of the criticism seems to stem from a lack of understanding of its brand and purpose.

Who is Akon & what is he doing in Benin?

Senegalese-American singer Akon received a special welcome when he arrived in Benin in August, the last stop on his tour of six African countries as part of his Akon Lighting Africa initiative. Benin's energy minister and other officials greeted him in the small, leather chair-adorned VIP lounge at the Cotonou airport.

What is Akoin & how does it work?

Find your audience. Akoin is a new cryptocurrency from visionary changemaker Akon and is the foundation of the Akoin Ecosystem. Growing up, Akon knew the struggles of living in the dark once the sun went down. The town in Senegal that he grew up in, like many others, had no access to running water or power.

The Senegal-raised singer's company is said to have structured some \$400 million worth of solar deals to date, including the massively successful launch of the Akon Lighting Africa initiative in February 2014, in which he has 200,000 small solar projects and provides lighting in 14 African countries.



Last month, the company announced a new phase of its initiative: Akon Lighting Africa is going to be building a "Solar Academy" in Bamako, Mali's capital, in order to teach the skills to build and



Because of this, he established Akon Lighting Africa as a for-profit company, not a non-profit charity, and it's also why he created the Solektra Solar Academy so that Africans can learn about solar power to become self-sufficient and not require charitable donations.



Akon's project aims to install solar equipment in households to improve energy sufficiency. He's partnered with Give1 Project, ADS Global Corporation SA and public-private solar energy companies. The Senegalese-American also met with government leaders about the project in Senegal, Gambia, the Ivory Coast and other countries.



Two years ago, the Grammy nominated singer started the company Akon Lighting Africa with the intent of bringing solar power to rural areas in The Mother Land. To date, the company has helped bring
