


The federal government does not provide free solar panels, but does provide incentives that reduce the cost of going solar. You can go solar with no upfront cost by taking out a \$0-down loan, signing a lease or PPA, or subscribing to a community solar farm. Of the no upfront cost solutions, \$0-down loans provide the best long-term savings.



Thanks to President Biden's Investing in America agenda, Americans may be eligible to receive a 30% federal tax credit if they installed or will install a solar photovoltaic system between 2022 and 2032, potentially reducing the cost of installation by more than \$7,500 for an average system.



Under the \$7 billion Solar for All program, the 60 grant recipients will create new or expand existing low-income solar programs, which will enable over 900,000 households in low-income and disadvantaged communities to benefit from distributed solar energy.
