



Are black Americans underrepresented in solar industry?

Black Americans are widely underrepresented in the solar industry. The Solar Foundation and the Solar Energy Industries Association published a diversity report earlier this year that found that executive leadership in solar companies is almost exclusively white men.

Who started blocpower?

This early experience with energy insecurity led Baird, 43, to start New York City-based climate tech company BlocPower in 2014, following a stint as a community organizer and program manager with labor unions in the Obama administration.

How much money did black climate tech founders make in 2022?

In 2022, according to Crunchbase, U.S.-based Black climate tech founders received only 1 percent, or \$214 million, of the \$21.5 billion raised in the industry that year.

What percentage of Solar executives are white?

The 2018 solar census found that 7.6% of 242,000 solar workers nationwide are African American. However, the executive leadership in solar companies is almost exclusively white men. 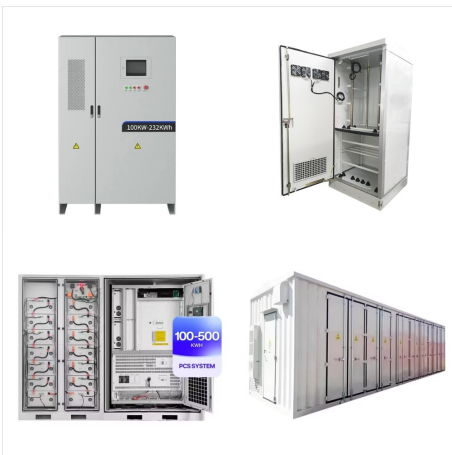

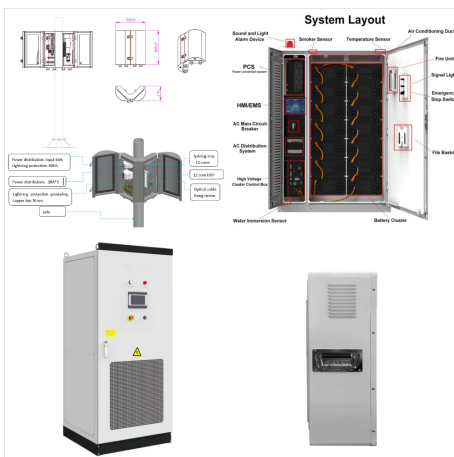

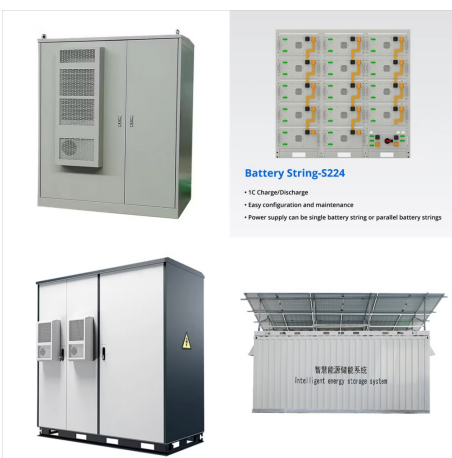
