

Federalismis a system of government that divides power between national and state governments. What is federalism? Federalism is a system of government that divides power between national and state governments. Why did the Framers choose a federal system? How do state governments balance the power of the federal government?

The individual state governments balance the power of the federal government. The states are governments of reserved powers. These are powers that the Constitution does not grant to the national government and does not deny to the states. For example, any state can require doctors, lawyers, or plumbers to be licensed.

How is power divided in the United States?

Power is first divided between the national, or federal government, and the state and local government under a system known as Federalism. At the federal level, the Constitution again divides power between the three major branches of our federal government--the legislative, the executive, and the judicial.

What powers do both federal and state governments share?

powers that both the national government and the states share Concurrent powersare powers that the state and federal governments share. For example, both the federal government and state governments collect taxes. Both governments also set punishments for crimes.

What is a system of government?

A system of government is where powers are divided between the national government and state or local governments. The Federal System grants the national government the authority that it requires to carry out the powers that are expressly defined in the Constitution.

Figure 3.2 There are three general systems of government--unitary systems, federations, and confederations--each of which allocates power differently. In a confederation, authority is decentralized, and the central government's ability to act depends on the consent of the subnational governments.

Federalism is a form of government that divides sovereign power across at least two political units. In the United States, power is divided among the national and state governments so that each government has some independent authority.



The Tenth Amendment provides that powers not expressly delegated to the federal government or prohibited to the states in the Constitution are reserved to the states or the people. This is one means by which the Constitution allocates power between the federal and state governments in the federalist system.
