Check Emissions System, Check VSA system, Check Power steering, and Check hill start assist system. The car was driving very funky after that. I then pulled over and turned the car off and then back on. The lights were still there. After about 30 minutes I tried starting again and they finally turned off and the car drove normally again.





3. VSA System Failure. If the VSA system has been turned off or there is a failure to the components, the light will remain on the dashboard. It's possible that the system was disabled through the switch on your console. ???




Check VSA System And after a minute Check Power Steering System. Then, I power the car off, and drive off it's fine for a while and then, repeats. The power steering abs and brakes were perfectly fine with no loss of power to the engine or anything strange it drives perfect even with the lights on.



While driving down the highway my CHECK VSA SYSTEM, CHECK HILL START ASSIST SYSTEM, CHECK ABS SYSTEM came on, followed a few second later by CHECK POWER STEERING SYSTEM, everything worked perfectly,tried to turn off the car but the push on/off button would not work like usuall and i had to hold it for atleast 3 second for the car to ???





Therefore, the failure of one or more of these sensors can lead to the illumination of a vehicle's VSA light. #3 ??? I recently had a stereo system installed in my 2013 Civic SI. I was driving and started smelling electrical smell so I pulled over. My husband told me to pull the fuse. I accidentally pulled the wrong one now the emissions and vsa check lights are on. My car cuts out at 3000 RPM. I connected the fuse back correctly but it hasn't fixed the problem.



It says "check brake system, check abs system, check vsa system, check hill start assist system" and after exactly 1 minute passes it adds "check power steering system." There are no changes in the driving when these lights are on, EXCEPT when I REVERSE DOWNHILL it makes a thunking sound. This sound doesn"t happen when the lights are off.





That fuse supplies power to the pgm-fi main relay #1. Hopefully the scan tool will supply a DTC to troubleshoot. If not; I would check the power and ground circuits for the ECM/PCM first. Use key words ecm power circuit to find the trouble shooting on service express or ISIs (tech should have access with his DPTS number.)



The first step to fix a "check power steering system" is to determine the warning message's cause. You can do this with the help of an OBD2 scan tool. You only need to scan for failing parts of the steering system and sensors.



In most cases, the sudden illumination of a vehicle's VSA and check engine light indicates that an active VSA fault has been logged. In this case, the secondary check engine light has been used as a generic means to indicate that an active fault exists.





There are warning lights associated with the VSA system. They are: 1. VSA System Light. The light listed simply as VSA is the system indicator light. If it stays on, it is letting you know that there is some problem with the RDX's VSA itself. When the light comes on, Acura suggests getting someplace safe and restarting the engine. If the VSA



I have had the ABS VSA and Power Steering Check Lights come on while driving come on randomly about 4-5 times. The car goes immediately into limp mode, and as I slow down, it starts to jerk, so I put it in neutral. Shut down the car and restart to clear.



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




We will need to start this by determining what the modules are having an issue with. The VSA is vehicle stability, and then there is the power steering message. There is likely a power steering fault which would then disable the vsa, causing that light to come on.

The messages and lights were Check Power Steering System (even though the power steering was working flawlessly) Check VSA System, and Check Emission System (for non 9th gen people, Essentially just the Check Engine Light).





Now while driving power steering locks up and I get check abs VSA power steering check brake system etc. Yesterday went to gas station yes I know I shouldn't be driving like this but it is my only car. Car was on but nothing worked dash lights imid stereo and even the idle was completely dead but car was on. Only code I get is Modulator



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About after a month of driving it I got a messages randomly that said check vsa, hill assist, power steering, and brake system. The brake system would disappear after about 5 seconds, but the VSA hill assist and power steering would remain.





I recently replaced the tie rods on my 07 MDX, and then drove the car (without having the alignment done yet) and the "Check VSA System" warning message came up on my dash display after about 10 minutes of driving. It had never come on before even with the bad tie rods and the steering wheel off a bit.
