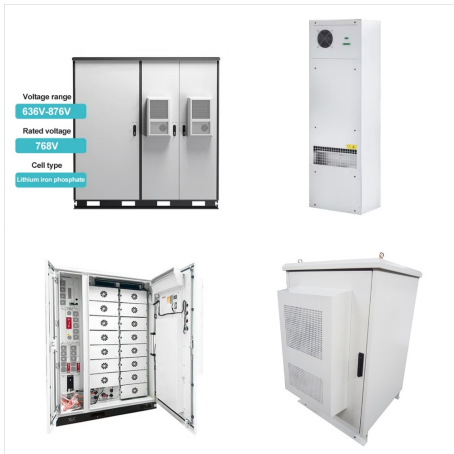

Click system wood flooring, also known as a lock system, has been introduced to the wood flooring market quite recently. It consists basically in covering the old flooring (however, it shouldn't be used in the case of uneven wood floors or over a carpet). Solid wood flooring is quite seldom available in the click flooring installation system.



Click or lock system flooring comes in engineered and solid wood options as well as laminate. Solid wood flooring, as the name suggests is made from a single plank of wood whereas engineered flooring is made up of a thin layer of wood glued on top of a plywood base.



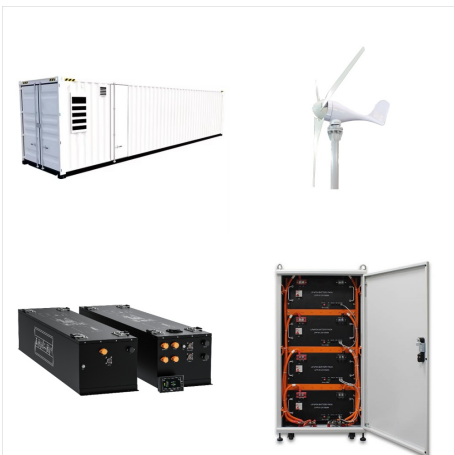
4. How does Click (or Lock) flooring compare to solid wood flooring in terms of appearance?  
Engineered Click (or Lock) flooring will look just like solid wood, due to the top layer of engineered hardwood flooring. However, laminate floors, although designed to look like real wood, don't quite achieve the same aesthetic as solid wood. 5.

The 5/16-in. thick snap flooring has specially shaped tongues and grooves that interlock to form a strong tight joint without glue or nails. Once the click lock laminate flooring is assembled, the entire floor "floats" in one large sheet.



Finished solid wood flooring, though, resists moisture well. Installing hardwood flooring is rarely a DIY-friendly project because it requires professional tools to handle tricky sanding, finishing, and spacing of the boards. 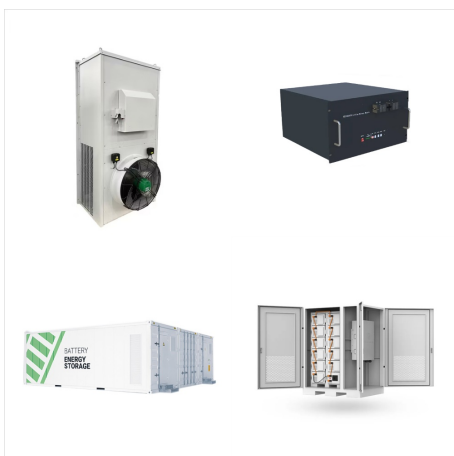
