How do the Cocos (Keeling) Islands communicate?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands have access to a range of modern communication services. Digital television stations are broadcast from Western Australia via satellite. A local radio station, 6CKI - Voice of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, is staffed by community volunteers and provides some local content.

Why are the Cocos Islands called the Keeling Islands?

The territory's dual name (official since the islands' incorporation into Australia in 1955) reflects that the islands have historically been known as either the Cocos Islands or the Keeling Islands. The territory consists of two atolls made up of 27 coral islands, of which only two - West Island and Home Island - are inhabited.

Who discovered the Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

British sea captain William KEELINGdiscovered the Cocos (Keeling) Islands in 1609,and they were named for their coconut trees in 1622. Some maps began referring to them as the Keeling Islands in 1703. In 1825,Scottish trader John CLUNIES-ROSS was trying to get to Christmas Island but was blown off course and landed on Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

What is the capital of Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

The capital of the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands is West Islandwhile the largest settlement is the village of Bantam, on Home Island. Governance of the islands is based on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands Act 1955 and depends heavily on the laws of Australia.

Why should you visit Cocos (Keeling) Islands?




