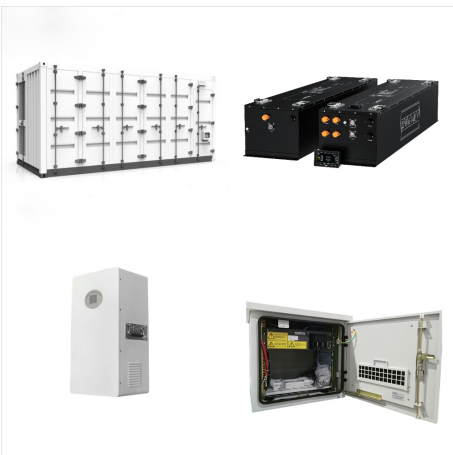
Is biomass a source of electricity in East Timor?

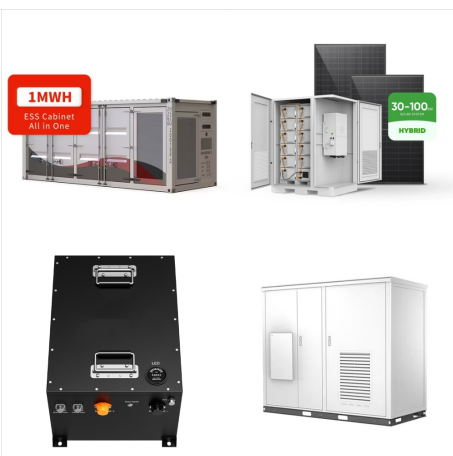

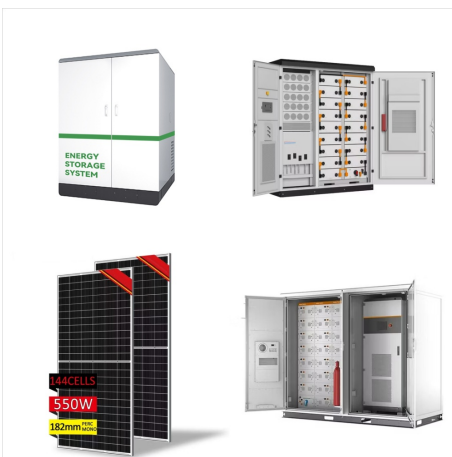
