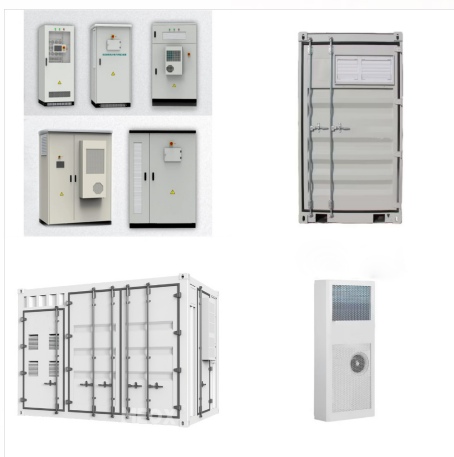

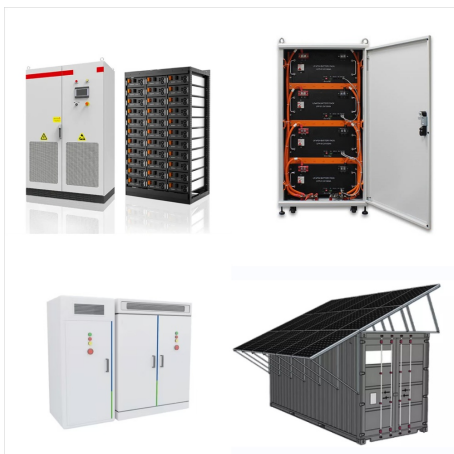
Our Team will conduct an assessment of Eswatini's e-commerce readiness to allow Eswatini to better engage in and benefit from e-commerce. The assessment will include an in-depth diagnostic of the national ecommerce ecosystem as well as a comprehensive strategy, including a detailed plan to implement priority actions, across a range of policy areas.



In 2022 the Eswatini Government has brought online a 10MW solar plant and will be awarding a solar generation license for the 50 MW to an IPP by late 2023. The government has scrapped the establishment of a 200 MW anthracite coal power plant to be setup at Lubhuku and decided to export the said coal .

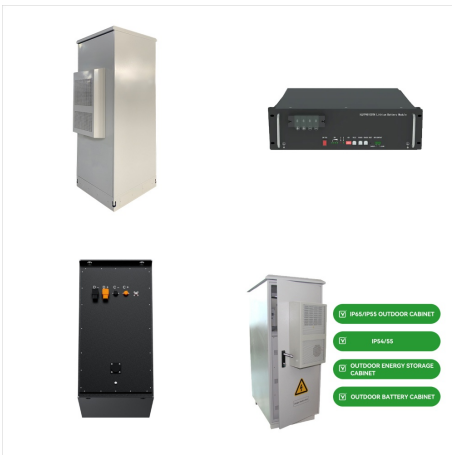

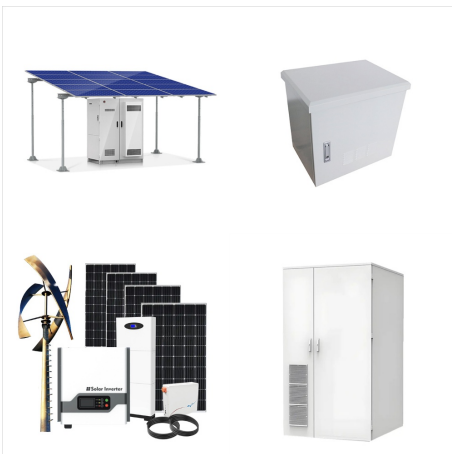

The main electricity supplier in South Africa has been implementing rolling power cuts, called load shedding, to various areas of the country. These findings points to the need for investments and development in the digital ecosystem to enable e-commerce in Eswatini, including putting in policy frameworks that will be supportive of online commerce. Meanwhile, financial inclusion is high in Eswatini, reported to be at 87 per cent in 2023, yet the use of digital financial services is low.



The assessment will be centered around 5 key areas in e-commerce: Physical Connectivity (Infrastructure ecosystem), Finance and Payments (Access to finance and e-payments ecosystem), Governance (Policies, regulations, e-gov and statistics), Online Markets Assessment of ESWATINI's E-Commerce Readiness.
