



What are genmoji?

Genmoji are custom emojis you can create if you've installed the iOS 18.2 or iPadOS 18.2 update. They are the emojis of your imagination, made real with help from Apple Intelligence -- you describe what emoji you want to see, like a sad cowboy or an octopus DJ, and Apple's AI will do its best to generate it.

What is genmoji on iPhone?

The Unicode Standard -- a universal character encoding standard -- is responsible for creating new emoji, and once a year the approved emoji are added to all devices. With Genmoji, you don't have to wait for new emoji to appear on your iPhone. You can create them as you need them. Here's how to use Genmoji on iPhone to create your own custom emoji.

How does genmoji work on iOS 18?

Available on iOS 18.2, Genmoji uses Apple Intelligence, Apple's advanced AI suite, to generate personalized emoji. You can base your Genmoji on a photo from your library, craft one using a text prompt, or customize Apple's existing emoji. Like traditional emoji, Genmoji can be added inline to messages or shared as stickers or Tapback reactions.

How do I create a genmoji?

Press the emoji icon in the bottom-left corner. Tap the emoji with a "+" in the top-right corner. Enter a description for your Genmoji (e.g., "alpaca with a sombrero"). Swipe from right to left to view all the generated variations. If you're happy with the result, tap the ellipsis button to add a caption or save it as a sticker.

How to create a genmoji on iPhone & iPad?

At the moment, you can only create Genmoji on iPhone and iPad, though Apple says the feature will be coming to Mac down the line. The steps to create a Genmoji are the same for iPhone and iPad. First, open a conversation and tap the text field to bring up the keyboard. Then tap either the smiley icon or the globe icon, depending on which you have.

How do I make a genmoji on Instagram?

Tap that and a text bar will appear prompting you to describe the emoji you'd like to create. Enter the description, then tap "Done." If you're making a Genmoji of a specific person, make sure you've already labeled them in your Photos app. Then, enter your description and tap the "Choose a Person" option above

the text field.

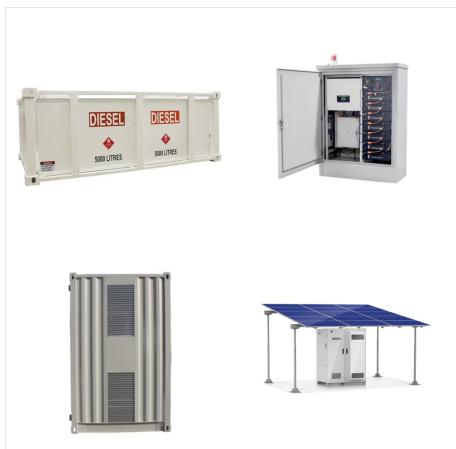

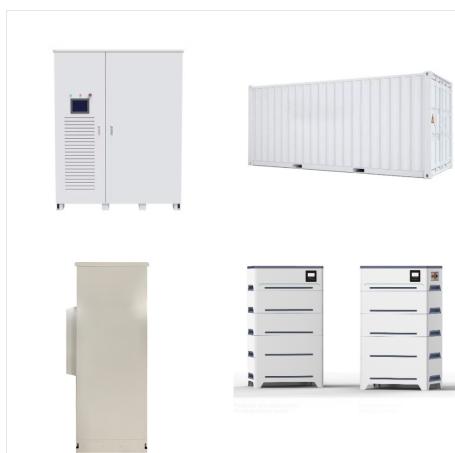
To add a Genemoji to a message, swipe through to find the Genemoji you want to use, then tap Add. To create a Genemoji based on a photo, enter the name of a person you've identified in your photo library, add a description—"Danny celebrating his 35th birthday," for example—then tap Choose a Person, select a person identified in your Photos.

Following a prompt, the Genmoji tool generates multiple variants of the emoji image design once the user has submitted the prompt, which the user can then scroll through to select their preferred generated emoji design. History. Emoji are a series of small Unicode-based images representing various concepts that originated in Japan but spread internationally throughout the 2000s. In 2011, Apple added an Emoji keyboard to iOS5, giving users the option to communicate using the symbols.
