

Guernsey Electricity Limited,in accordance with section 23 (2) (b) of the Electricity (Guernsey) Law 2001,hereby gives notices that the maximum resale price at which electricity can be resold by persons to whom it is supplied is *25 pence per unit. What Is A Tariff? Put simply,a tariff calculates your bill.

Does Guernsey Electricity charge a monthly charge?

Where Guernsey Electricity is required to provide a standby electricity service for 'behind the meter' non-renewable energy installations (including CHP) with generation capacity in excess of 25kW, a monthly charge will be applied. For every kW of installed capacity, we charge the standby rate.

Will Guernsey's energy price rises help pay off debts?

Guernsey Electricity (GEL) has warned customers to expect further price rises so it can pay off current debtsand cover the costs of decarbonising the island. The firm said in its annual report new tariff increases would also help meet the costs of maintaining its infrastructure so energy supplies were "secure and reliable".

Why did Guernsey's Electricity price halve?

The company said a long-standing agreement with France to supply electricity at a fixed costhad nearly halved the price of electricity for people in Guernsey over recent years. It said pressures such as the war in Ukraine had forced prices up in the UK and elsewhere, but Guernsey had been protected from this by the agreement with France.




