

Can I bring a lithium battery on a plane?

You may bring spare lithium batteries for devices such as laptops, cell phones and cameras, in carry-on baggage only. This also includes external battery chargers (portable rechargers) containing a lithium-ion battery. Guests are limited to no more than two (2) spares per person, not to exceed 160 watt-hours.

How do airlines handle lithium battery fires?

"We train all our crewmembers to safely suppress lithium battery fires," Da Silva said. "And we were one of the first airlines to carry special fireproof bags and gloves." Da Silva added that "the containment bag, not an extinguisher" are the preferred way to address battery fires.

Can I carry a lithium ion battery on a POC?

Your POC, PAP, respirator or ventilator may not contain a lithium ion battery that exceeds 160-watt hours (160 WH). NOTE: No more than two individually protected lithium ion batteries each exceeding 100-watt hours (100 WH), but not exceeding 160-watt hours (160 WH), may be carried per person as spare batteries in carry-on baggage only.

Are lithium ion batteries allowed in mobility devices?

Lithium metal (non-rechargeable lithium) batteries are forbidden with these devices. Lithium ion batteries must be removed from this type of mobility device and battery terminals protected from short circuit. The battery must be protected from damage (e.g. by placing each battery in a protective pouch).

Are Airlines prepared for battery fires?

He also hopes that airlines ensure their staff are prepared for battery fires -- which the FAA reports have happened on more than 40 passenger flights in 2024, and 64 times in 2023. Are lithium drones allowed in checked baggage?

Lithium Drones are permitted if all power sources are removed and packed as stated in g (i), g (ii), and g (iii) below and do not exceed regulatory limits. E-cigarettes or electronic smoking devices, prohibited in checked

baggage. Electronic smoking devices shall only be permitted in the passenger's carry-on baggage.



Lithium batteries may overheat, leading to thermal runaway, and thus require safety testing. They should be carried in carry-on baggage only. Spare lithium batteries must be in carry-on, with terminals protected. The size limit for lithium-ion batteries is 100 Wh. Larger lithium ion batteries (101-160 Wh) are allowed with airline approval.

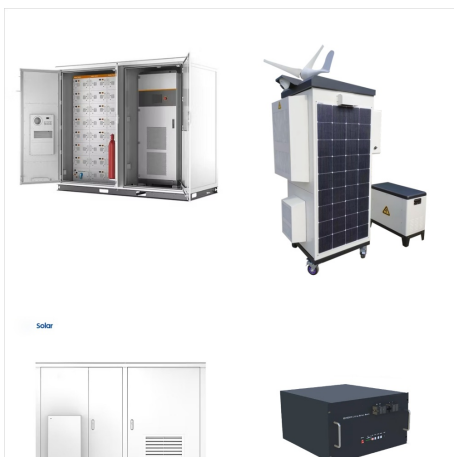

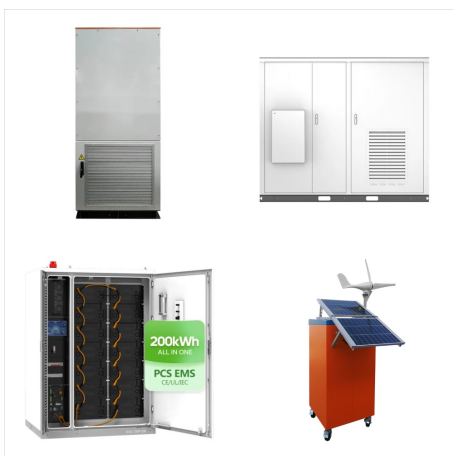

Spare (uninstalled) lithium ion and lithium metal batteries, including power banks and cell phone battery charging cases, must be carried in carry-on baggage only. With airline approval, passengers may also carry up to two spare larger lithium ion batteries (101-160 Wh) or lithium metal batteries (2-8 grams).



Lithium-ion batteries are an essential part of our modern lives, powering everything from smartphones to electric vehicles. Spare lithium batteries of any type, including external battery chargers (portable rechargers) containing a lithium-ion battery, may not be placed in checked baggage because of the potential fire hazard. 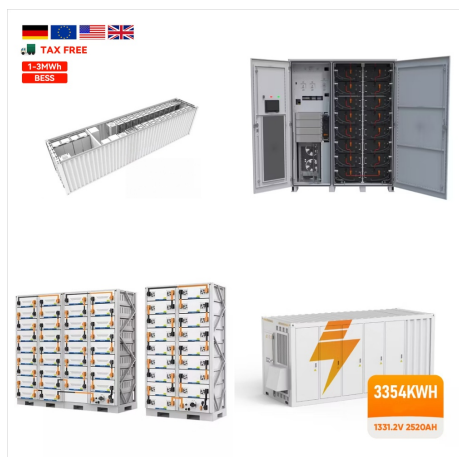

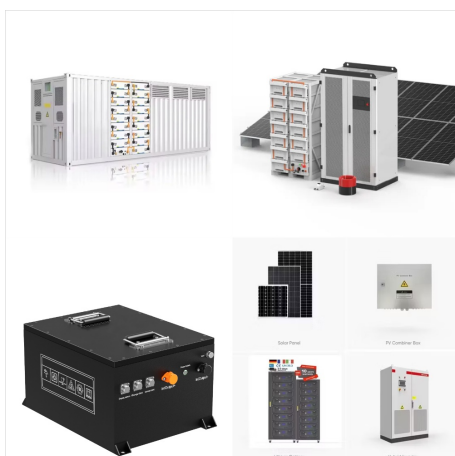
