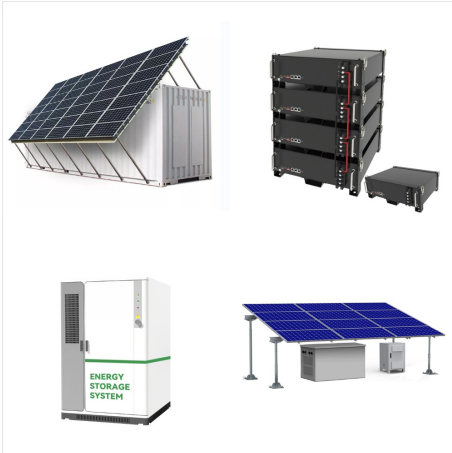

The African Development Bank's investments in The Gambia's energy sector have significantly improved access to affordable and reliable electricity, with at least 70% of Gambians projected to have power by the end of 2024 (50% in rural areas), according to a recent Bank country progress report. On the same day, Keystone Bank Limited was issued a commercial banking license by the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN). Keystone Bank assumed the assets and some liabilities of the now defunct Bank PHB. In June 2015 Keystone was re-named MegaBank Gambia Limited.
