1. Formation of the Solar System Presentation and Notes. I love to use visuals as I teach, so I like to use a quick presentation to talk about the important steps and big ideas in the formation of the solar system.. Lesson Plan: Solar System, Grades: K - 2nd, Subject: Teaching Degree. Bachelor's Degree in Education; Master's in Education M.Ed. Degree; Teach students a mnemonic device about the solar system to help them learn the names of the planets. Have students make a mnemonic flip sheet: Lift the flap to view the Planet name.



While there is so much to teach our little ones with this theme, I decided to work on teaching my little guy the names of the planets and their order. I used an anagram and a scavenger hunt around the backyard to explore outer space. These activities are perfect for teaching kindergarteners all about the solar system.



These planets are in orbit around the Sun, which is a star. There are also dwarf planets (such as Pluto), moons, comets, and asteroids in the Milky Way solar system. Our solar system is one of approximately 30 billion solar systems within the Milkyway, and then billions more other galaxies. These kinds of numbers can be hard for toddlers to





Show the kids a diagram of the solar system, have them draw it on a white coaster-sized circle, and then cut a slit in the middle. Make sure the adult cuts the hole. Then place a penny in the middle to stand in as the sun. Once they"re made, kids will have a blast seeing how fast they can spin their solar system.



How to Teach the Solar System. The Solar System is located in a galaxy called the Milky Way that contains 100 billion stars. It is made up of eight planets, dwarf planets, satellites, asteroids, and comets. The planets that revolve around the Sun are: Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune.



How to teach Solar System. Using Solar System Activity, students play Space Race to practice identifying and correctly ordering the eight planets in our solar system. Knowing the order of the planets will help your students as they learn more about each planet. The further the planet is away from the Sun changes the make up of the planet.
