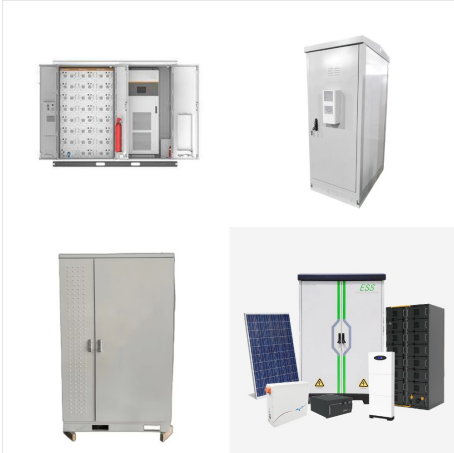
Does insurance cover roof-mounted solar panels?

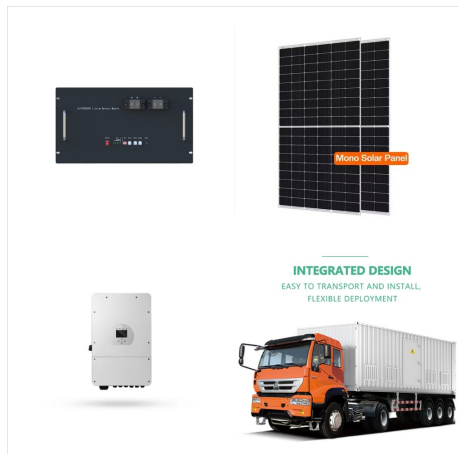

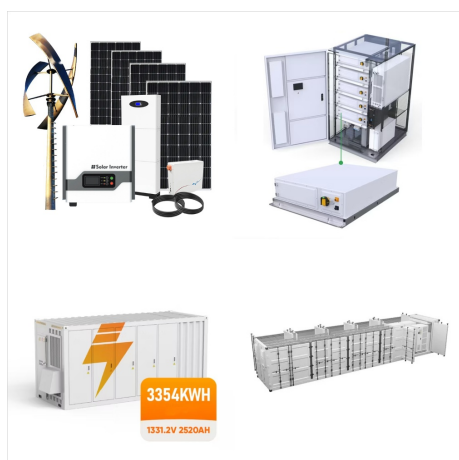

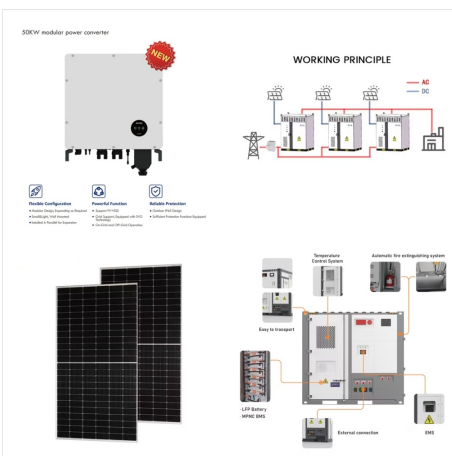
