The EUR 75 million is the first tranche of money Kosovo will receive from the EU's Energy Support Package for the Western Balkans worth EUR 1 billion created by the EU and its Member States to help the region overcome the energy crisis and the major energy prices increase caused by Russia's unjustified and unprovoked full-scale invasion against Ukraine.



In June 2018, the American company initiated a tender for the construction of Kosovo's third power plant, named "Kosova e Re." This energy project, boasting a capacity of 500 megawatts, was initially projected to cost 1.3 billion euros. The agreement with ContourGlobal was seen as one of the largest foreign investments in Kosovo.



The power of diaspora Kosovo's diaspora has been instrumental in the success of many of the country's businesses. As well as providing a ready source of human capital for companies to work with in response to growing demand, the diaspora has provided a market for Kosovan products in new regions, which has encouraged international expansion of Kosovan businesses.



Over 80% of Kosovo's primary energy[1] is from coal, and the economy is highly energy intensive.[2] And 90% of electricity is from coal, namely 2 old lignite plants, but the country suffers from shortages of power at peak demand in the winter season. Sibovc Mine in Pristina, was the largest mine in Kosovo, producing approximately 8.08 million metric tons per annum (mmtpa) of Run-of-Mine (ROM) in 2021. The Sibovc Mine is owned by Kosovo Energy Corp, and is due to operate until 2051. The second largest mine with approximately 0.9 mmtpa of ROM, was the Hani i Elezi Mine located in Ferizaj.
