Solarever,a Mexican solar module manufacturer,announced this week it intends to invest \$1 billion in the construction of its second solar panel factory in Zacoalco de Torres,in the state of Jalisco. The new manufacturing facility is expected to produce both cells and modules and to cover a surface of around 1,000 m2.

How much did sengi solar invest in Paraná & Pernambuco?

In a separate development, Brazilian PV system provider Sengi Solar announced an investment of BRL 440 million (\$85 million) for the construction of two solar panel factories in the states of Paraná and Pernambuco. The two facilities are to have a combined capacity of 1 GW.
