

Can a lithium battery be attached to a mailpiece?

Except for mailpieces containing button cell batteries properly installed in the equipment they are intended to operate, mailpieces containing mailable lithium metal or lithium-ion batteries must be rigid, sealed, and of adequate size, so the lithium battery mark can be affixed to the address side without the mark being folded.

Did the postal service change the shipping standards for lithium batteries?

The Postal Service announced these revisions via a Federal Register notice titled "Revision to Mailing Standards for Lithium Batteries," which was published on July 26, 2017 (82 FR 34712-34715).

How do I mail a lithium battery?

1. The primary lithium cells and batteries must be mailed in "the originally sealed packaging". 2. The sealed packages of batteries must be separated and cushioned to prevent short circuit, movement, or damage. 3.

Can I mail a lithium battery internationally?

Mailing batteries internationally, or to and from APO, FPO, or DPO destinations, is prohibited regardless of mail class. See IMM 136 for details. a. General. The following restrictions apply to the mailability of all primary lithium (nonrechargeable) cells and batteries: 1.

Can I ship lithium batteries via USPS?

#1: Yes, you can ship lithium batteries via USPS. However ... There are currently six types of lithium batteries eligible for shipment, in varying domestic or international quantities, via USPS: Don't forget the new lithium battery marks that became mandatory this year!

Are lithium-ion and lithium polymer batteries allowed in Postal Service Air-eligible products?

n Generally prohibit UN3480 lithium-ion and lithium polymer batteries in Postal Service air-eligible products.



Lithium batteries are dangerous goods, and all of the regulatory requirements must be complied with, as set out in the Lithium Battery Shipping Regulations. In the United States, failure to comply with these regulations can result in a civil penalty of up to \$27,000 per offence (LBSR 1.3).



This article includes updates effective March 12, 2021. Shipping Regulations When shipping lithium batteries, businesses must comply with U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) standards and Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) standards for preparing shipments that contain lithium batteries.



Shipping lithium batteries via USPS requires careful attention to safety guidelines and regulations to ensure smooth and secure delivery. Choose proper packaging: Use sturdy, non-conductive materials like cardboard or plastic to pack lithium batteries securely, avoiding metal packaging to prevent short circuits.



All mailable hazardous materials eligible to be sent as USPS Marketing Mail, USPS Retail Ground, Parcel Select, or Parcel Return Service must be prepared under the requirements that apply to surface transportation. Pre-owned, damaged, or defective electronic devices containing or packaged with lithium batteries (see 349.12e) must be mailed

If your laptop has a lithium battery, you have to use a special label that indicates that your package contains lithium batteries. You can get this label from a postal store or online. The label should have the words "Lithium Battery" and "UN 3481" on it, ???



? 3. International Restrictions: International battery shipments have more stringent regulations due to safety concerns. USPS prohibits shipping lithium batteries internationally via mail. However, you can send other non-spillable and spillable batteries internationally, subject to specific packaging requirements and restrictions imposed by the destination country.



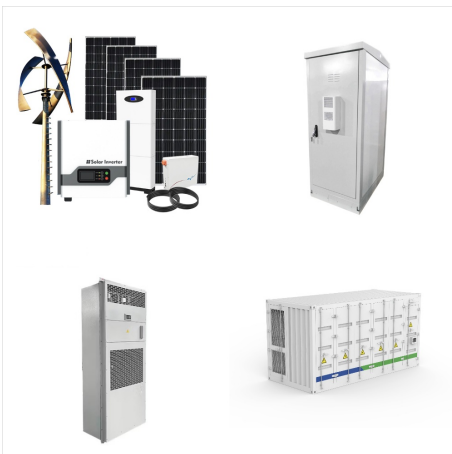

MAILING LITHIUM BATTERIES USPS



When mailing lithium batteries, UPS recommends using a Priority Mail Flat Rate Box. These boxes have internal padding, so the risk of damage to the batteries and loss of power is minimized. UPS does not recommend the use of Small Package boxes for shipping lithium batteries because they are too small and can result in damage to the battery.



The U.S. Postal Service has announced new final rules, effective immediately, that significantly impact the shipping of lithium batteries and other hazardous materials by mail.. 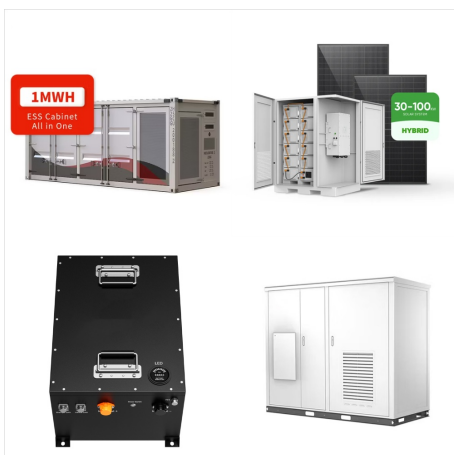
I. Introduction. On Monday, January 26, 2015, the United States Parcel Service (USPS) published a notice in the Federal Register that describes revisions to USPS Publication 52, Hazardous Restricted, and Perishable Mail.. These revisions closely align USPS requirements for shipping lithium cells and batteries with those found in both the U.S. D.O.T. and ???



LITHIUM BATTERIES. Lithium batteries power numerous electronics from cell phones, laptops, and tablets to wireless headphones, toys, and portable tools. What is not generally known is that these batteries are considered hazardous materials and remain highly regulated in transportation.



The Postal Service announced these revisions via a Federal Register notice titled "Revision to Mailing Standards for Lithium Batteries," which was published on July 26, 2017 (82 FR 34712-34715). With these revisions, the Postal Service aligns its mailing standards with recent changes made by other federal regulatory agencies with regard



Effective May 16, 2012, the Postal Service??? will revise Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM (R)) section 601.10.20 to codify that primary lithium ???



On August 17, 2017, the Postal Service ??? revised Publication 52, Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail, to provide new mailing standards for mailpieces containing lithium batteries. The Postal Service detailed these revisions in Postal Bulletin 22474 (8-17-17, pages 4???12), and announced a transitional period until January 1, 2018.



1. Unless otherwise prohibited by the international destination country or specific APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code location. 2. Used, damaged, defective, or recalled lithium batteries and used, damaged, or defective electronic devices containing or packaged with lithium batteries are prohibited and may not be mailed internationally or to, from or between APO, FPO, or DPO locations under ???



Most depleted batteries, including lithium-ion batteries used in handheld scanners and other portable electronic devices, contain hazardous components and must not be thrown in the trash. (MDC*). The internal battery mail-back programs were canceled due to USPS (R) mailing restrictions and safety concerns.



Additionally, the Postal Service is revising Pub 52 to reflect new Postal Service requirements that pre-owned, damaged, or defective electronic devices (such as cell phones, laptops, tablets, cameras, etc.) packaged with or containing lithium batteries be mailed only via surface transportation (USPS Retail Ground (R), Parcel Select (R), Parcel
