Is Mauritania poised to become a major supplier of natural gas?

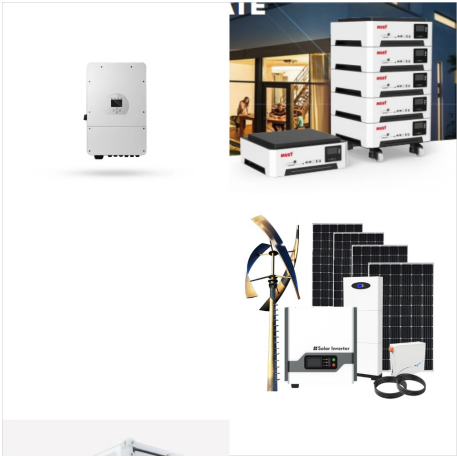

The first project, the 225 Kv Mauritania-Mali electricity interconnection and associated solar power plants development project (PIEMM), is part of the AfDB's Desert to Power Initiative, which aims to provide universal access to electricity in the Sahel region by harnessing the abundant solar potential.



Set to be one of Africa's biggest green hydrogen projects, CWP Global's \$40 billion, 30 GW AMAN development will be located in the Dakhlet Nouadhibou and Inchiri areas of Mauritania's northern region. Its 18 GW of wind and 12 GW of solar will power electrolysis inland, generating 10 million tons of green ammonia per annum.
