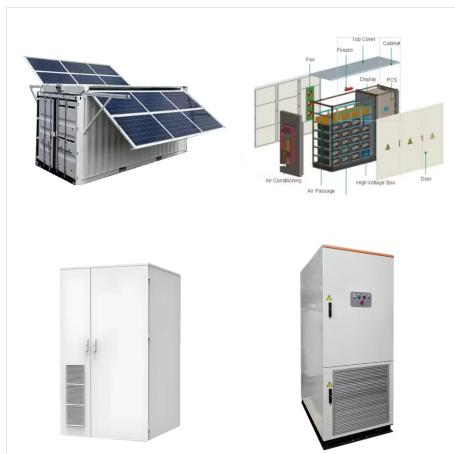

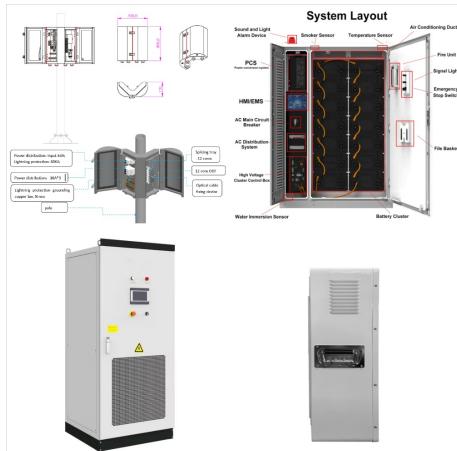

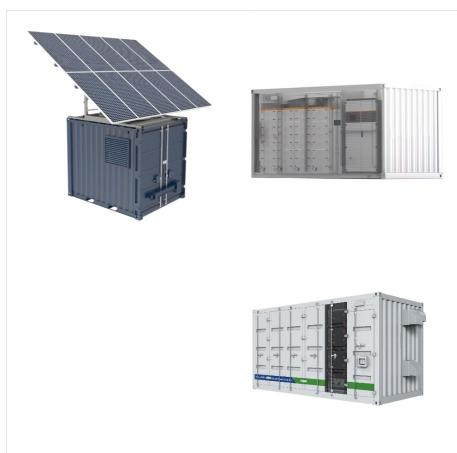

Maximum Power Point Tracking (MPPT) will ensure that your system's output is based on the 400Wp panel. Thus, your total output will be $400 \times 2 = 800$

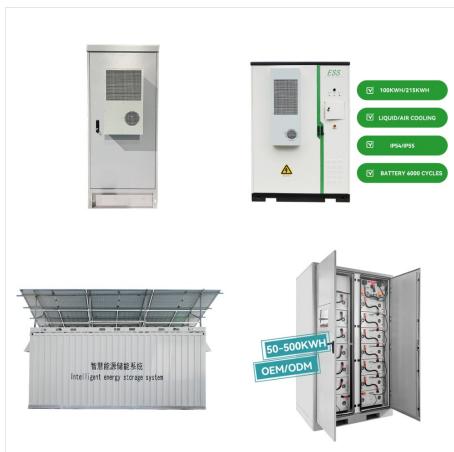

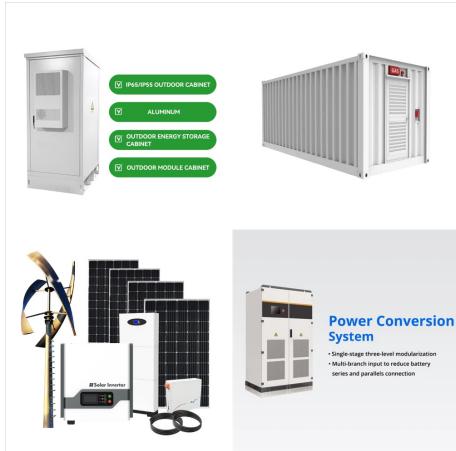

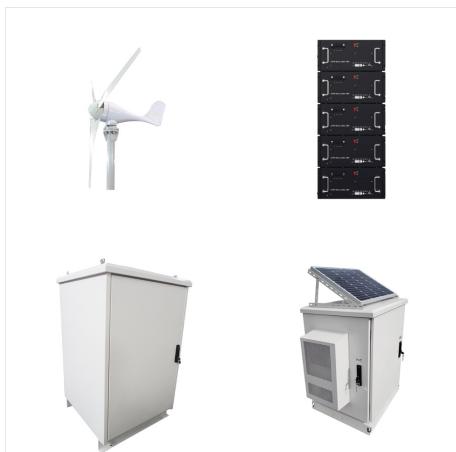
