

Where is Niger located?

Niger is located at the bottom of the UN Human Development Index. Roughly 92% of the population lives in rural areas in the Tillabéri region along the western frontier, and there is a chronic scarcity of clean water, particularly during the hot season, when temperatures regularly exceed 40 degrees Celsius.

Is Niger a coup d'état?

Pentagon spokeswoman Sabrina Singh said that the situation in Niger "looks like an attempted coup", reflecting the United States' continued refusal to call the events in Niger a coup d'état. Residents of Niamey began preparations for a voluntary mass recruitment of citizens over the age of 18 to assist the military in case of an invasion.

Niger,[a]officially the Republic of the Niger,[b]is a landlocked country in West Africa. It is a unitary state bordered by Libya to the northeast,Chad to the east,Nigeria to the south,Benin and Burkina Faso to the southwest,Mali to the west,and Algeria to the northwest.

Niger had previously undergone four military coupssince independence from France in 1960,with the most recent having occurred in 2010.

Why is Niger a bulwark?

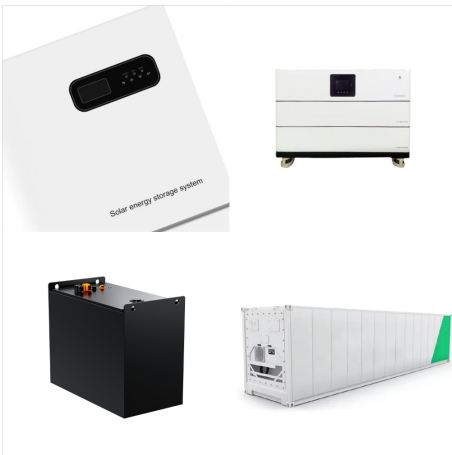

Niger is a landlocked nation in West Africa located along the border between the Sahara and Sub-Saharan regions. It borders Nigeria and Benin to the south, Burkina Faso and Mali to the west, Algeria and Libya to the north and Chad to the east. Niger lies between latitudes 11° and 24°N, and longitudes 0° and 16°E. Its area is 1,267,000



Disruption within Niger following the coup has continued, with demonstrations, censorship of broadcasts and interruptions to power supplies, as well as evacuations of foreign nationals. The situation eventually escalated into a serious international crisis that has led to threats of military intervention by ECOWAS and heightened tensions and

In 2023, UNOCHA reported 4.5 million people, or 17% of the population, requiring humanitarian assistance in Niger, compared to 3.7 million in 2022. In July 2024, according to UNHCR, Niger hosted almost 968,000 refugees, asylum-seekers and internally displaced people (IDPs), a majority of which are hosted in Tillaberi, Diffa and Tahoua regions.
