What is North Korea's strategic force?

North Korea's Strategic Force operates the regime's ballistic missiles. The service's mission is nuclear and conventional ballistic missile strike against targets inside and outside the region.

Does North Korea monitor US military operations?

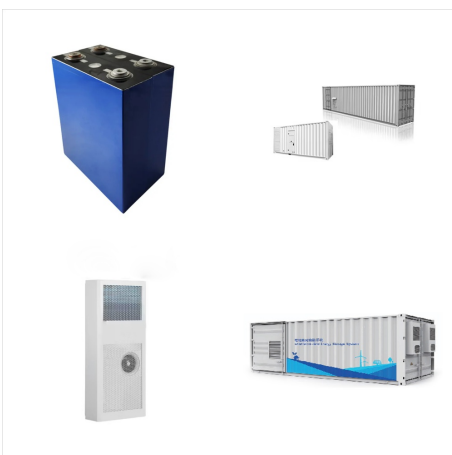

(1) Deputies to the organs of State power at all levels have close ties with their constituents and are accountable to them for their work.



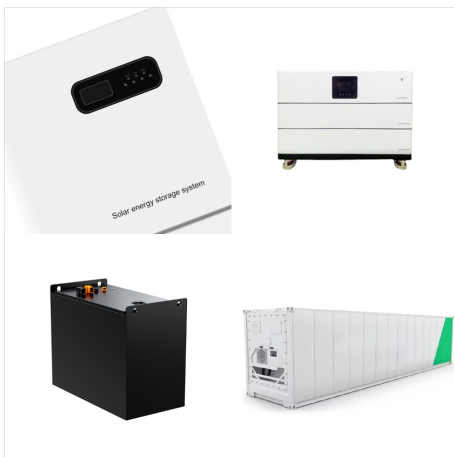

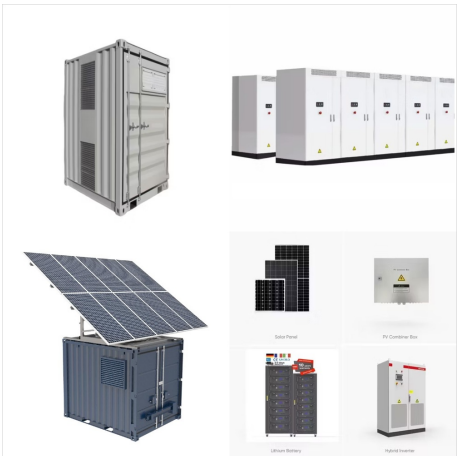
