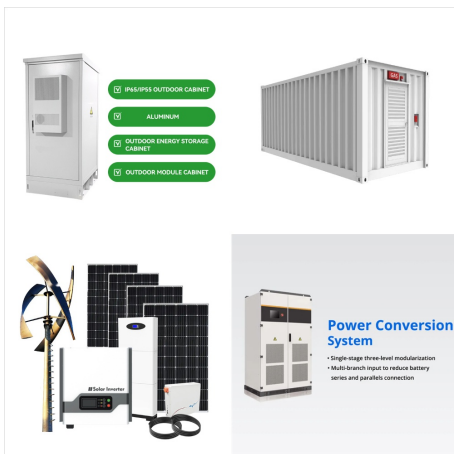

9. Philip Larkin, "Solar". One of Philip Larkin's most lyrical poems, "Solar" as the title suggests celebrates the sun as a force of energy giving us life and light. "You give for ever." (Physicists would quibble over that "for ever", since the sun will eventually run out of fuel, but we get Larkin's point.)

With an orbital rotation lasting over 11 Earth years, the planet has swirling clouds, including its famous Great Red Spot. Finally, Jupiter has 75 revolving moons, making it seem like its own solar system.

One of its moons is called Europa. Many scientists believe that Europa has liquid water under its icy crust. Because it is one of the few bodies in the solar system that might contain liquid water, it is a prime candidate for exploration and the search for extra-terrestrial life (NASA sent a Jupiter probe in August 2011).
