

In 2013, 25.7% of the energy in Portugal was renewable, increasing to 27% in 2014 and 28% in 2016. By 2020, this number increased to around 30%. Portugal made worldwide news when in February 2016, 95% of the electricity produced in Portugal was sourced from renewable energy, including biomass, hydropower, wind power, and solar power.



Renewable generation supplied 61% of the electricity consumption in Portugal in 2023, totalling 31.2 TWh, the highest-ever recorded value in the Portuguese national system. Wind power supplied 25% of the consumption in Portugal, hydropower contributed 23%, photovoltaics accounted for 7% and biomass for 6%.



Renewable Energy Milestones in Portugal. In 2023, Portugal witnessed a 70% increase in hydroelectric power production and a 43% rise in solar energy generation compared to the previous year. These advancements underscore the nation's dedication to reducing its carbon footprint and embracing clean energy solutions.





In 2022, renewables accounted for around 59% of the electricity generated in Portugal. The breakdown typically includes about 25???30% from hydroelectric power, 25% from wind power, and around 10% from solar energy. Solar panels, Alcoutim. The Serpa solar power plant is an 11 megawatt plant covered 150 acres (0.61 km 2) and employs 52,000 PV panels.
