

Car batteries, rechargeable batteries (including AA,9-volt, the one in the back of your cell phone, and the like), and even button cell watch batteries contain heavy metals and other toxic chemicals. Recycling batteries like these is often required by law.

Where can I recycle a battery?

Businesses including Home Depot,Lowe's,and Stapleshave electronics recycling programs that accept batteries and other e-waste at stores across the country as well. Some Best Buy locations take batteries,too. Earth911 and Call2Recycle have tools to help locate recycling drop-off points, allowing you to search for collections by battery type.

Can rechargeable batteries be recycled?

Rechargeable batteries can be recycled. Look for the battery recycling seals on rechargeable batteries.

Recycling companies dispose of the components of rechargeable batteries properly. The metals and chemicals don't end up in streams and landfills. The Home Depot has partnered with Call2Recycle, a nonprofit battery recycling program.

Do you have to pay for recycling a battery?

You may have to pay for recycling. These batteries are typically found in watches or hearing aids. Manufacturers may offer take-back recycling programs. Single-use batteries do not contain heavy metals, which limits their recycling market. You may have to pay for recycling.

Does home depot recycle batteries?

The Home Depot has partnered with Call2Recycle, a nonprofit battery recycling program. Rechargeable batteries can be dropped off in Call2Recycle bins at the store. Any rechargeable battery that weighs up to 11 pounds and is under 300 watt hours is accepted. There's no charge for recycling.

Can Li-ion batteries be recycled?

EPA recommendation: Contact the manufacturer, automobile dealer or company that installed the Li-ion battery for management options; do not put it in the trash or municipal recycling bins. Because of the size and complexity of these battery systems, medium and large-scale Li-ion batteries may not be able to be removed by the consumer.

When it's time to get rid of the batteries, start by checking local ordinances. A few cities and towns will recycle any batteries for you if you just leave them in a plastic bag on top of your trashcan. About half of states have laws mandating specific disposal methods for consumers.



Call2Recycle is a battery recycling program used across North America. Although not every state is required to follow battery recycling regulations, the ones that are required to usually have stores that collect used batteries, such as pharmacies, office supply stores, or hardware stores.





You must take batteries to an authorized recycling center, a universal waste handler or a household hazardous waste disposal facility. When you know how to dispose of batteries, you can help the environment. Dropoff sites typically accept rechargeable batteries for recycling. For single-use batteries, you can get a mail-order recycling kit.

You can also recycle used rechargeable batteries at any one of Call2Recycle's more than 25,000 drop-off sites in North America. Call2Recycle estimates that 86 percent of North Americans live within 10 miles (15 kilometers) of a drop-off location.



Many drop-off services offer battery recycling for free, while some sites require a small charge. Outside of not throwing used batteries in the trash, you should also take care not to leave old batteries inside a device for extended periods. Old batteries tend to leak, which will cause damage to your devices.



Year-round battery recycling locations. Before recycling your used batteries, it's important to prepare them correctly to avoid any risks, such as short-circuiting or accidental fires. Here's how: Use plastic bags or tape. To prevent short-circuiting, which can occur if the terminals of different batteries touch, place each battery in a separate plastic bag. Alternatively, cover
