

A Vatican Radio territory in north Rome once blamed for electro-smog will become a solar farm Pope Francis has decreed that an area of northern Rome long used by Vatican Radio will now house a

Vatican City may be the smallest sovereign state in the world, but it is also one of the greenest. It has long been an exemplar for tackling climate change through its approach to renewable energy. Thanks to a unique photovoltaic plant installed on the roof of the Vatican Audience Hall, the Papal State has been producing 300 MWh of solar energy





Pope Francis has announced measures to transition Vatican City to using solar energy as its main source of electricity, as outlined in his latest motu proprio titled Fratello Sole, or "Brother Sun.". The Holy Father has tasked the relevant Vatican governing bodies to collaborate with Italian authorities and build an "agrivoltaic system," which would use land in Santa Maria di Galeria





The Holy City has installed 2,400 photovoltaic solar panels to the top of one of the city's buildings. In doing so, the Vatican will reduce CO2 emissions by 225 tons a year and save 80 tons of oil. The solar panels are not visible from the ground, but the angels in St. Peter's Basilica may have to wear sunglasses to fight off the glare from the



Pope Francis has announced plans for the Vatican City to go solar through his latest motu proprio, Fratello Sole, or Brother Sun. The pope has delegated Vatican governing bodies to work with the Italian government to build an agrivoltaics system in the lands of Santa Maria di Galeria, located outside of Rome and an extra-territory of Vatican City.
