

What happened to Lorde's 'solar power'?

After another four-year hiatus, Lorde returned in June with a new single, "Solar Power." The song received a mixed reaction upon its release, with many saying that it hewed too closely to two other pop songs: George Michael's "Freedom! '90" and Primal Scream's "Loaded."

Is Lorde's solar power a pop oddity?

Time will tell whether Lorde's Solar Power is a pop oddity, or the precursor to the a once dominant mode coming back into vogue. Lorde's heavy use of the mixolydian mode--which propels "Royals" and "Green Light"--makes "Solar Power" feel both sunny and monotonous.

Does Lorde sound like George Michael's 'Faith'?

Some comparisons with Michael's 'Faith' were also spotted on Twitter. "I'm so old the Lorde song sounds like a cover of George Michael - Freedom '90," author Miles Klee joked. PR veteran Judy Miller Silverman tweeted, "Lorde giving me George Michael Freedom vibes."

Is Lorde's 'solar power' a good album?

Lorde's wonderful third album, Solar Power, is too complex to be basic. But it does shrug off the baggage that has been placed upon Lorde, upon stardom, and upon happiness itself in the influencer age. Gone are the creepy keyboards and the image of a teen girl with hunched posture in black cloaks.

What does Lorde do on solar power?

On Solar Power, Lorde surrenders to normalcy--and finds transcendence. Ever since people started slinging around the word basic as an insult, delights as disparate as pumpkin-spice lattes, the music of Lizzo, and sunsets have gotten a bad rap. The diss refers to pleasure--simple pleasures, normal pleasures, things that everyone can enjoy.

Why does Lorde's 'solar power' not wow?

Lorde's prioritization of private pleasure over the duties of pop stardom helps explain the parts of Solar Power that don't wow: a clutch of ballads written with such memoirist precision, and such disinterest in big catharsis, that they may exist more for her sake than the listener's. Yet even the duller fare makes a point.

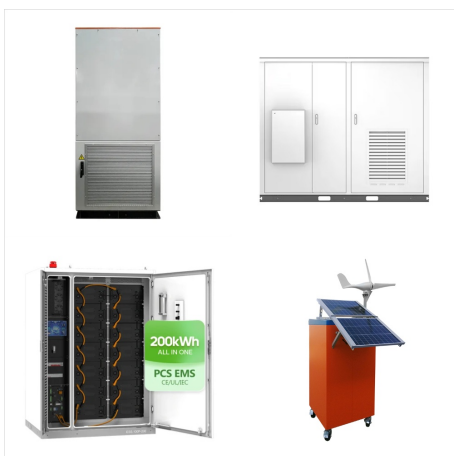

But I don't think Solar Power as a whole was bad, and I do think to an extent it's suffering from people's preconceived notions of what a Lorde album should sound like. I think there are other pop/indie artists who could put this record out and receive more praise than Lorde is receiving.

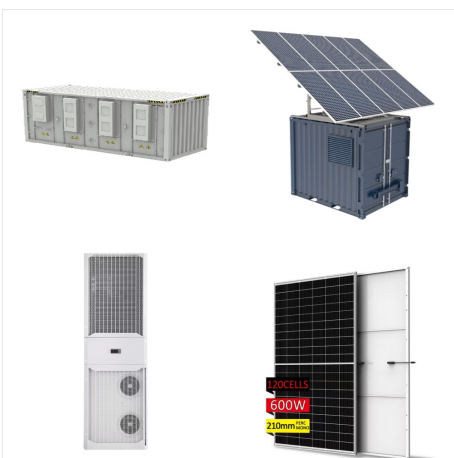

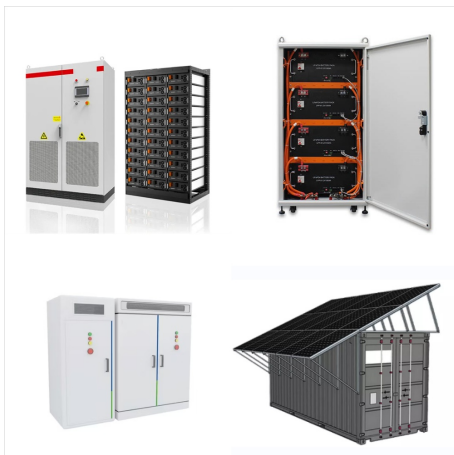

Lorde's interest in all things earthly extends to Solar Power's more organic, indie-folk sound, aided in part by the contributions of veteran session drummer Matt Chamberlain, whose crisp percussion provides the thrust of "The Path" and "Mood Ring." The album's second half, however, loses momentum, and one begins to miss the 808s

With Solar Power, Lorde seems less committal. Instead of departing from pop to create a real folk record influenced by nature, she opted for a halfway point between Lana Del Rey and Colbie Caillat. There are lush, dreamy ballads that sound like Norman ***ing Rockwell b-sides, and there is acoustic pop that sounds like Coco sans any hooks



After a nearly four-year hiatus, 24-year-old singer Lorde released her single "Solar Power": a Bohemian anthem rife with breezy vocals and gentle percussion. Alongside the drop of the single, Lorde put out a music video featuring her frolicking on a sandy beach in a two-piece lemon-colored outfit.

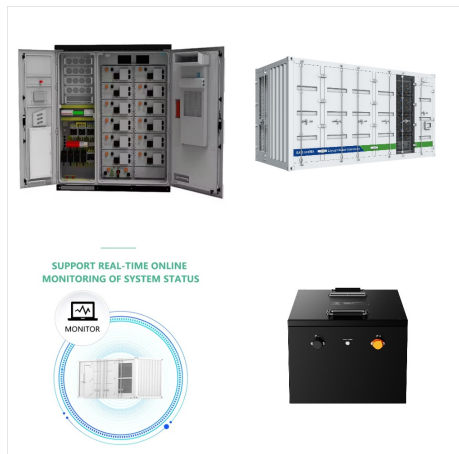
