

Should the Faroe Islands be self-sufficient?

Isolated in the North Atlantic Ocean, the Faroe Islands need to be self-sufficient in terms of electricity generation as the Faroese electrical grid is not interconnected to neighbouring countries. SEV operates six hydro power plants, three thermal power plants, three wind farms and one solar power plant.

How many wind farms are there in the Faroe Islands?

Furthermore, external suppliers operate one wind farm and one biomass plant. Total installed capacity in the Faroe Islands is 163 MW and total power generation in 2019 was 386 GWh. Max demand was 63.1 MW in November 2020. In 2018, 49% of power generation came from renewable sources, i.e. hydro and wind power, respectively.

Are there renewables in the Faroe Islands?

"In the Faroe Islands, we are blessed with renewables: we have wind, hydro and some sun in the summer; we also have tidal and wave power where we can see great potential," says Nielsen. Since announcing its green vision in 2014, SEV has already done a lot to increase the share of renewables in its energy mix.

Why is SEV the main power supplier in the Faroe Islands?

SEV is the main power supplier in the Faroe Islands. We operate on 17 of the 18 islands that constitute the Faroe Islands. Isolated in the North Atlantic Ocean, the Faroe Islands need to be self-sufficient in terms of electricity generation as the Faroese electrical grid is not interconnected to neighbouring countries.

Will the Faroe Islands use more green energy in 2025?

Even more conservative scenarios predict that the Faroe Islands' current electricity consumption of approximately 350,000 MWh per year will increase to approximately 450,000 MWh in 2025. "The current discussion recommends using more green energy and especially the potential for wind energy is quite high," says one of the islanders.

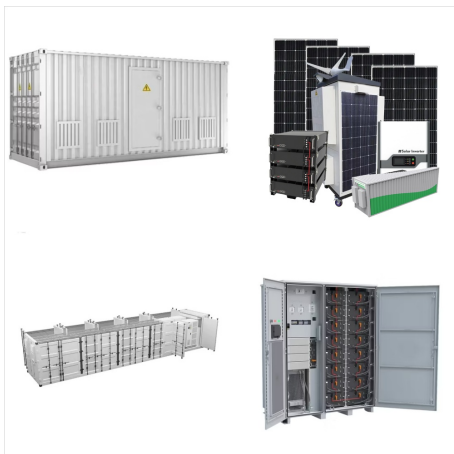

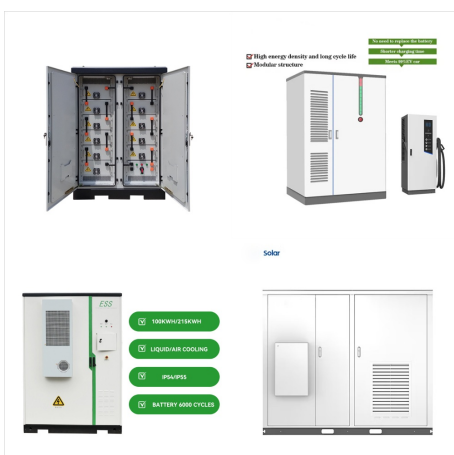

The winter in Faroe Islands experiences essentially constant cloud cover, with the percentage of time that the sky is overcast or mostly cloudy remaining about 71% throughout the season. The highest chance of overcast or mostly cloudy conditions is 73% on January 28.. The clearest day of the winter is December 1, with clear, mostly clear, or partly cloudy conditions 31% of the time.



Many ships have wrecked in the treacherous waters around the Faroe Islands. Eiði is a village located on the north-west tip of Eysturoy, Faroe Islands. Its name means isthmus in the Faroese language. The town has a population of 669 inhabitants. Saksun was even well-groomed in a northwest corner of the Faroe's main island, Streymoy, in a sort of antipode to capital Torshavn. The village appears inland, sheltered between two lakes. In December, the Faroe Islands experience wind, rain, and a fleeting sense of sunshine. Temperatures hover between 3°C and 7°C, but with wind chill, for some crystal-clear skies. In December, the Faroe Islands sees the shortest period of light with sunrise at around 9.30 AM and sunset at 3 PM - daylight lasting only about five hours.



The Faroes have an extensive network of roads and sub-sea tunnels, efficiently connecting major parts across the islands. While the vast majority of the roads are high-quality, some have sharp curves, correlating to the hilly topography, one of which is the iconic road to the village of Norðradalur in the island of Streymoy, renowned for its winding shape and wondrous ???



The Villingardalsfjall hike starts in Vidareidi village, the northernmost town in the Faroe Islands. The trailhead is located at the end of Garðsvegur road in Við Garð, the northern part of the village. There's no car park directly at the trailhead. The closest parking area (8-9 cars max) is located just down the road from the trailhead.



G?sadalur is one of the most isolated villages in the Faroe Islands of Denmark. This small village is home to a dozen people. Getting there was a difficult task before the single tunnel road was completed in 2004. The only options for visiting G?sadalur village used to be a strenuous hike around the mountain, a boat ride, or a helicopter flight.
