

What is the national dish of the Gambia?

The national dish of the Gambia is Domoda. Attaya, in addition to being a traditional beverage, is one of the country's national drinks. The national instrument of the Gambia is Kora. The country has the time zone UTC (GMT) followed by dd/mm/yyyy as the standard date format. The Gambia is divided into 5 regions and 1 city.

Why is the Gambia a member of ECOWAS?

As a member of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS), The Gambia has played an active role in that organisation's efforts to resolve the civil wars in Liberia and Sierra Leone and contributed troops to the community's ceasefire monitoring group (ECOMOG) in 1990 and (ECOMIL) in 2003.

What kind of literature does the Gambia have?

As with other West African countries, The Gambia has a tradition of oral literature, including the griots, traditional storytellers and musicians. Since the 1960s, an English-language Gambian literature has emerged.

What is the economy of the Gambia?

The Gambia's economy is dominated by farming, fishing, and especially tourism. In 2022, 17.2% of the population lived in extreme poverty, defined as living on less than US\$2.15 (2017 PPP) per day. The Gambia is a founding member of the ECOWAS. It rejoined the Commonwealth of Nations in 2018 after previously withdrawing in 2013.



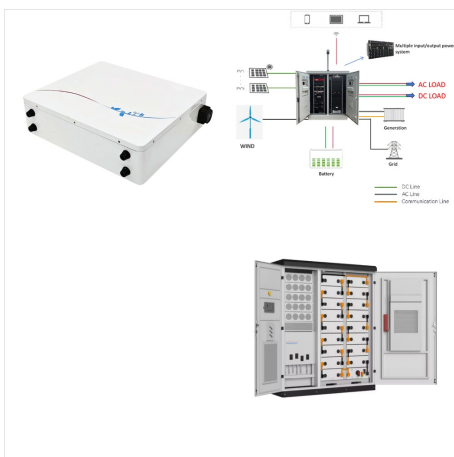

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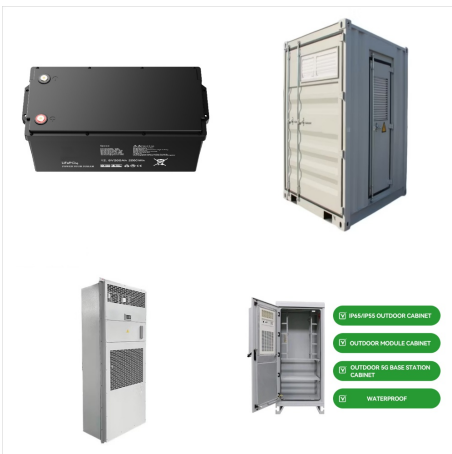

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The wildlife of the Gambia is dictated by several habitat zones over the Gambia's land area of about 10,000 km<sup>2</sup>. It is bound in the south by the savanna and on the north by the Sudanian woodlands. The habitats host abundant indigenous plants and animals, in addition to migrant species and newly planted species.



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
