Due to the exercise of these powers, the federal court system is composed of three separate levels.

What is the judicial power of the United States?

The Constitution and the Federal Judiciary U.S. CONSTITUTION ARTICLE III The judicial power of the United States shall be vested in one supreme Court, and in such inferior Courts as the Congress may from time to time ordain and establish.

What power does Congress have to create a federal court?

The Constitution gives Congress the power to create federal courts other than the Supreme Court and to determine their jurisdiction. It is Congress, not the judiciary, that controls the type of cases that may be addressed in the federal courts. Congress has three other basic respon - sibilities that determine how the courts will operate.

How many federal courts are there in the United States?

The U.S. Constitution established only one federal court--the U.S. Supreme Court. Beyond this, Article III of the Constitution left it to the discretion of Congress to "ordain and establish" lower federal courts to conduct the judicial business of the federal government.

How did the Constitution affect the judicial branch?

The Constitution elaborated neither the exact powers and prerogatives of the Supreme Court nor the



organization of the Judicial Branch as a whole. Thus, it was left to Congress and to the Justices of the Court through their decisions to develop the Federal Judiciary and a body of Federal law.
