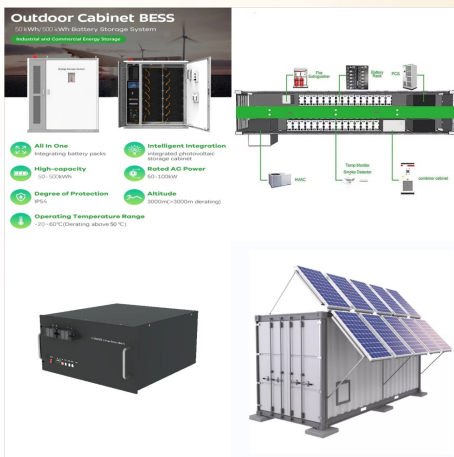
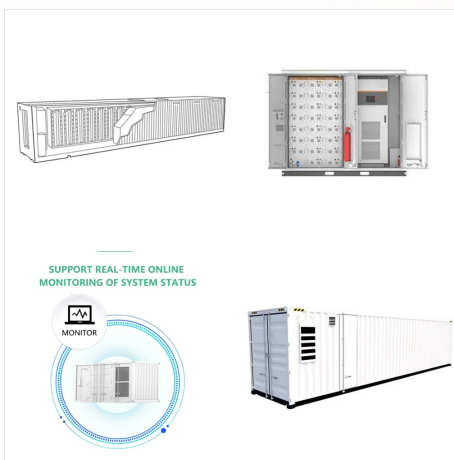

According to the statement, Scatec will now commence construction of the two solar plants, having secured 20-year power purchase agreements (PPAs) with Tunisian state-owned utility STEG in 2019.
