Tuvalu (/tu:'v?:lu: /i) too-VAH-loo) [7 ]is an island country in the Polynesian subregion of Oceania in the Pacific Ocean,about midway between Hawaii and Australia.

Is Tuvalu still a Pacific island nation?

Tuvalu,a Pacific island nation on the frontline of the climate crisis,is fighting to retain its land--and its identity. Tuvalu participates in the work of the Pacific Community(SPC) and is a member of the Pacific Islands Forum,the Commonwealth of Nations and the United Nations. It has maintained a mission at the United Nations in New York City since 2000.

Is Tuvalu A low-lying island?

Formerly known as the Ellice Islands,all are low-lying,with no point on Tuvalu being higher than 4.5m above sea level. Local politicians have campaigned against climate change,arguing that it could see the islands swamped by rising sea levels. Life on the islands is simple and often harsh.

What is Tuvalu known for?

Besides being on the frontline of the climate crisis,Tuvalu is known for two things: it is one of the least visited countries in the world,and it owns the .tv domain suffix,which is the country's second greatest source of revenue after selling the rights to its fishing territories.

Where did Tuvalu come from?

There are no photos for Tuvalu. The islands were first populated by voyagers from either Samoa or Tongain the first millennium A.D.,and Tuvalu provided a steppingstone for various Polynesian communities that subsequently settled in Melanesia and Micronesia.


