Homestays are available on Home Island, and can be arranged through Zulaika at the Island Brunch Cafe.

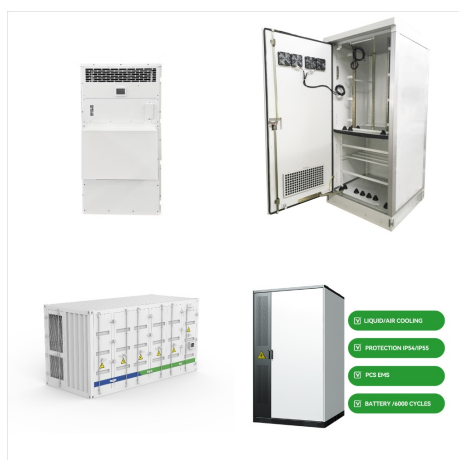
