The federal government has historically played a minor role in education. In fact, the federal government did not issue any educational policy until the 1960s. The federal laws with the most impact on education concern:

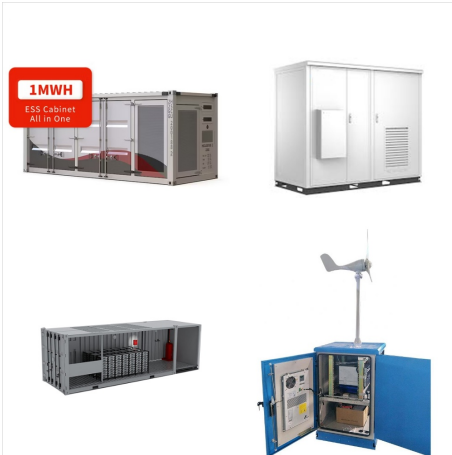
Is it time to address power dynamics in education systems transformation?
